Description:

The Vision Grants program is designed to support the field in producing research that disrupts long-standing inequities toward more just and equitable systems. While we are in a time of major challenges in education, we are also in a moment of possibility. We believe that visionary and cross-disciplinary/multi-method scholarship, conducted in generative collaboration with stakeholders in the field, including policy-makers, practitioners, and communities, can contribute to reimagining and transforming educational systems toward equity.

Vision Grants will provide planning funds for teams to develop proposals for research projects that:

- · Are focused on key challenges and opportunities that have the potential for increasing equity in education
- · Engage across disciplines and/or research methods
- · Collaborate with practitioners, policymakers, and communities (and other stakeholders) Have clear sightlines to transformational change through research at a systemic level

Description:

The Research-Practice Partnership (RPP) Grants Program is intended to support education research projects that engage in collaborative and participatory partnerships with project budgets up to \$400,000 and durations of up to three years. We accept Intent to Apply forms once a year in this program.

We view partnerships as an important approach to knowledge generation and the improvement of education, broadly construed. Over the long term, we anticipate that research conducted by RPPs will result in new insights into the processes, practices, and policies that improve education for learners, educators, families, communities, and institutions where learning and teaching happen (e.g., schools, universities, museums, other workplaces).

Kennisbenutting Plus

Deadline for applications: Continuous

Budget: €100.000

Description:

Hoofdaanvragers van een lopend of net afgerond NRO-project kunnen een aanvraag indienen voor financiering van producten of activiteiten die de kennisbenutting van hun onderzoeksproject bevorderen. Aanvragen worden samen met een partner uit praktijk of beleid ingediend.

Aanvragen voor NRO Kennisbenutting Plus worden ingediend door de hoofdaanvrager van een lopend of net afgerond NRO-project, samen met een of meer partners uit praktijk of beleid. Dit kan een partner zijn uit het bestaande onderzoeksconsortium, maar het mag ook een nieuwe partner zijn.

Het totaal beschikbare budget voor NRO Kennisbenutting Plus is 50.000 euro per jaar. Het aan te vragen budget per project bedraagt maximaal 10.000 euro. De financiering wordt verstrekt in de vorm van een lumpsum vergoeding voor de termijn van maximaal 12 maanden.



Use of NCO-database in PhD and Postdoc research 2023

Description:

2016. NRO launched the National Education Cohort Study (NCO; www.nationaalcohortonderzoek.nl for further information; only available in Dutch). This longitudinal education research is based on the registers of Statistics Netherlands (CBS) and DUO (Netherlands Education Executive Agency) and student monitoring systems, supplemented by modules that focus on specific subjects for which no register data are available. These modules include additional data on subjects such as socio-emotional development, citizenship or choice-of-study behaviour. The aim of the NCO is to build an authoritative database that can be used for both fundamental and policy-oriented education research.

The Programmacommittee NCO aims to stimulate the use of the NCO database in PhD and Postdoc research with this funding round.

PhD students and postdoc researchers who received their doctorate degree between June 1st 2018 and December 1st 2023.



RAAK-public June 2023

Deadline for applications: June 20, 2023

Budget: €5,400,000

Description:

Professors of applied sciences and researchers from universities of applied sciences conduct research together with professionals working in the public sector. This leads to knowledge and innovations that contribute to solving social issues.

The RAAK-public scheme promotes cooperation between professionals working in the public sector and universities of applied sciences. The focus of the collaboration is on knowledge development and application. Driven by the demand from professionals, networks of universities of applied sciences and professionals carry out research. The result of the research is practical knowledge for professional practice. The research also provides a demonstrable contribution to the renewal of higher vocational education.

The applicant must be a government-funded university of applied sciences, as defined in Article 1.8 of the Law on Higher Education and Research Act (WHW). The Executive Board (EB) of the coordinating university of applied sciences appoints the project manager (university employee) who is the contact person on behalf of the Taksforce for Applied Research SIA.



Open Access Books

Deadline for applications: Continuous

Budget: €1,500,000

Description:

Project leaders or co-applicants of awarded NWO research projects can apply for funding of the costs of Open Access publishing of academic books that result from NWO funding. This instrument has a short lead time (maximum 6 weeks) and the procedure is relatively simple.

The aim of this funding instrument is to stimulate the Open Access publication of academic books that result from NWO funding by providing funds for the payment of Book Processing Charges. Open access means your book can be read, shared and cited digitally without readers having to buy it. Open access thus increases the chances of your work being widely read and having an impact. Open access publishing does not prevent a possible simultaneous publication of the printed book.



Doctoral Grant for Teachers, 2nd round 2023

Deadline for applications: September 12, 2023

Description:

Teachers from primary, secondary, further professional, higher professional and special education can receive a grant for a PhD study. The aim is to directly apply the knowledge and research experience acquired for the benefit of educational practice. A higher number of practising teachers with a PhD also increases the quality of education and strengthens the connections between universities and schools. You can apply for a PhD grant for any research subject. However, you must be able to indicate the importance.

With the PhD grant a replacement teacher can be appointed for a period of 5 years for half of your contract hours, up to a maximum of 0.4 fte.
