Description:

PhD-educated teachers with a fixed contract in secondary education or post-secondary vocational education can apply for a postdoc grant to conduct practice oriented research on a topic related to the science and/or technology curriculum.

Teachers can apply for postdoc funding for either two or three years of funding. The grant is to be used to pay for a substitute teacher for 0,4 fte for the duration of the project, i.e. either two or three years.

A grant holder's employer will receive the personnel budget of the grant's funding. The employer will receive one of the following standardised budget per year to pay for a substitute teacher, as based on the average wage rates for 0,4 fte:

- for teachers in special secondary education (vso): €30.900 per year;
- for teachers in secondary education (vo): €33.000 per year;
- for teachers in post-secondary vocational education (mbo): €33.800 per year.

The grant also includes a budget of a maximum of €2.000 per grant holder per year to be used for research expenses.

Description:

For this funding round, you can apply for funding for a periodic assessment of student achievements on artistic orientation of children in their final year in primary school.

The aim of this periodic assessment is to give a valid and reliable view of student achievements in the field of artistic orientation, partly in relation to the results of previous periodic assessments in this field. Additionally, the periodic assessment should give an overview of education in the arts in primary schools.

An application can by submitted by a main applicant and fellow applicant(s). This means a collaboration between researchers that are affiliated with (research institutes that affiliated with) universities in the Kingdom of the Netherlands, institutes for higher education of other researchers/representatives of other educational institutes that perform independent education research on a similar level.

Maximum budget for this funding round is €575.000--. One application will be funded.

Description:

The Executive Boards of universities located in the Kingdom of the Netherlands can submit applications to NWO (max. 4 per university).

Funding can be requested for new and additional new costs directly related to the research programme or to the organisation of the consortium. This includes:

- New (and existing) personnel and material facilities;
- Investments in equipment/infrastructure and other facilities as well as the costs of exploiting these up to a maximum of 25% of the requested contribution;
- Management costs for the consortium for a maximum period of 10 years.
- Only the principal investigator and a maximum of five co-PIs from the consortium may request funding to cover their replacement while they are doing research in a Gravitation programme, maxed out to 20% of the total salary cost

Researchers with ideas for improving the world can apply for funding through Open Mind. NWO Domain Applied and Engineering Sciences (AES) is looking for surprising new research ideas in which technology is used to obtain applications with a societal impact. Researchers are invited to submit out-of-the-box ideas providing sustainable solutions for global societal challenges (in line with people, planet, profit).

NWO domain Applied and Engineering Sciences has a total budget of 350,000 euro available. Seven Open Mind grants will receive funding, with a maximum of 50,000 euro (inclusive of Dutch VAT) each for the period of one year.

Open Mind funds project-specific costs of:

- 1. personnel temporarily appointed to the project at the research institute
- 2. research leave for applicants
- 3. materials (consumables, small instruments and aids, and domestic travel travel expenses)
- 4. foreign travel.
