### Description:

The William T. Grant Scholars Program supports career development for promising early-career researchers. The program funds five-year research and mentoring plans that significantly expand researchers' expertise in new disciplines, methods, and content areas.

Applicants should have a track record of conducting high-quality research and an interest in pursuing a significant shift in their trajectories as researchers. We recognize that early-career researchers are rarely given incentives or support to take measured risks in their work, so this award includes a mentoring component, as well as a supportive academic community.

Applicants must be nominated by their institutions. Major divisions (e.g., College of Arts and Sciences, Medical School) of an institution may nominate only one applicant each year. In addition to the eligibility criteria below, deans and directors of those divisions should refer to the Selection Criteria (pp. 32-36) to aid them in choosing their nominees. Applicants of any discipline are eligible.

**Applicants outside the United States are eligible.** As with U.S. applicants, they must pursue research that has compelling policy or practice implications for youth in the United States.

### Description:

The Institutional Challenge Grant encourages university-based research institutes, schools, and centers to build sustained research-practice partnerships with public agencies or nonprofit organizations in order to reduce inequality in youth outcomes.

The award supports research institutions to build sustained research-practice partnerships with public agencies or nonprofit organizations in order to reduce inequality in youth outcomes.

Eligible organizations include university-based research institutes, schools, or centers. Institutions that sit outside of the academy, such as research organizations and think tanks, are not eligible.

## Research Grants on Reducing Inequality

### Description:

This program supports research to build, test, or increase understanding of programs, policies, or practices to reduce inequality in the academic, social, behavioral, or economic outcomes of young people ages 5-25 in the United States. We prioritize studies that aim to reduce inequalities that exist along dimensions of race, ethnicity, economic standing, language minority status, or immigrant origins.

Our research interests center on studies that examine ways to reduce inequality in youth outcomes. We welcome descriptive studies that clarify mechanisms for reducing inequality or elucidate how or why a specific program, policy, or practice operates to reduce inequality. We also welcome intervention studies that examine attempts to reduce inequality. Finally, we welcome studies that improve the measurement of inequality in ways that can enhance the work of researchers, practitioners, or policymakers.

### Description:

This program supports research on strategies to improve the use of research evidence in ways that benefit young people ages 5-25 in the United States. We want to know what it takes to produce useful research evidence, what it takes to get research used, and what happens when research is used. We welcome letters of inquiry for studies that pursue one of these broad aims.

Studying ways to improve the use of research evidence will require new and innovative ideas, and we welcome creative studies that have potential to advance the field. Proposals for studies are evaluated on the basis of their fit with our interests; the strength and feasibility of their designs, methods, and analyses; their potential to inform improvements to research use; and their contribution to theory and empirical evidence.

### **Description:**

Professors of applied sciences and researchers from universities of applied sciences conduct research together with professionals working in the public sector. This leads to knowledge and innovations that contribute to solving social issues.

The RAAK-publiek scheme promotes cooperation between professionals working in the public sector and universities of applied sciences. The focus of the collaboration is on knowledge development and application. Driven by the demand from professionals, networks of universities of applied sciences and professionals carry out research. The result of the research is practical knowledge for the professional practice. The research also provides a demonstrable contribution to the renewal of higher vocational education.

The maximum grant size is 300.000,- euro. The project duration is max. 24 months.

### **Description:**

## Use NCO database in PhD and postdoc research 2022

### **Description:**

Since 2016, the NRO has been working on building up the NCO. The core is to set up longitudinal education research based on the registers and pupil monitoring systems, supplemented with modules aimed at specific subjects for which no register data is available. These modules include, for example, additional data on social-emotional development, citizenship or study choice behaviour. The aim is to build up a leading data file that is used for both fundamental and policy-oriented educational research.

### **Criteria:**

- (1) Applicant is a PhD student or postdoc who obtained his PhD between 15 September 2017 and 15 September 2022;
  - (2) The institution where the research is conducted is authorized to conduct remote access research with Statistics Netherlands;
  - (3) Its budget is maximum 5,000 euros and according to the guidelines in the call for proposals drawn up.

### **Description:**

The Small Research Grants on Education Program supports education research projects that will contribute to the improvement of education, broadly conceived, with budgets up to \$50,000 for projects ranging from one to five years. Eligible investigators may also request additional supplemental funds for a course release. We accept applications three times per year.

This program is “field-initiated” in that proposal submissions are not in response to a specific request for a particular research topic, discipline, design, method, or location. Our goal for this program is to support rigorous, intellectually ambitious and technically sound research that is relevant to the most pressing questions and compelling opportunities in education.
